Will require work to restore power to the building and some repairs but using the existing will be much less expensive than building new. Anderson Hill in Richford – visited the site along with Motorola. This site will work for us.

- CAD Project Laptops and cellular modems have been delivered and will be
 installed in the next couple of weeks. State Police Info Tech and Communications
 groups have been working to get the system installed in the State Police cars. Fire
 Departments have been submitting their response plans that will be mapped and
 entered into the system. Bill Ostrander has been making the additions.
- EMS Study The results of the EMS study have been presented to multiple groups in the county. Conversations with the Supervisors of smaller communities indicate that EMS shortcomings cannot be resolved economically by local government.
- Emergency Management Public Assistance Workshop being held at Public Safety Building evening of October 19th and morning of October 20th. This class is especially important for local governmental officials who will be working with damage claims for disasters. Two Tier 3 Emergency Management Training scheduled for this fall. Citizens Preparedness classes requested two classes to be conduct prior to the end of this year. Multi-Hazard for Schools classes scheduled for October. Four people signed up. Based on the number of signups, the class will be cancelled.

NEW BUSINESS:

Fire Radio System – an outage occurred. The telephone line that connects the
dispatch center to the tower sites quit working and several circuit boards in radio
equipment was damaged. This was old equipment. Located new circuit boards
and the system was partially operating in about 5 hours. Took 4 days for Verizon to
locate the damaged line and restore service.

Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report November 8, 2022

Budget Status:

2022 Revenue Budget:

- \$690 of DWI Supervision fee collected in October. \$6,690 collected to date in 2022
- \$677.99 in restitution and surcharge collected in October. \$202,435.49 collected to date in 2022

2022 Budget: On target, expended 70.3% to date.

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing We continue to have one open Probation Officer 1 position. We are still awaiting results from the June Civil Service exam before we consider filling the position.
- 2. Training Probation Officers Mike Franz and Joe Lanzillotto have successfully completed Fundamentals of Probation Practice and have met all mandatory state training.
- 3. The collaboration with the Tioga Career Center continues to evolve. This Director, Tioga County Department of Social Services (TCDSS) Director of Services Elizabeth Myers and staff from the Career Center attended a joint meeting in Utica, NY in October with other grant recipients from Warren County to discuss the progress being made and how to best move forward.
- 4. The Probation Administrative Team has begun the process of updating and reviewing all policies and procedures within the Department. The goal is to assure equitable enforcement of all conditions of probation and be current with best practices in all other aspects of the Probation profession.
- 5. A collaborative meeting with TCDSS Director of Services Elizabeth Myers, Probation, and the County Attorney was held in October to discuss the impacts of the "Raise the Lower Age" legislation which takes affect December 29, 2022. Discussion focused on how the agencies can work together to support TCDSS when they take on their new responsibilities going forward.
- 6. Probation began the process of purchasing a vehicle with the Pretrial Services Grant Award that was received from DCJS in October. A portion of the \$60,000 Award will be used to purchase a reliable vehicle to help support the expansion of Pretrial Services throughout Tioga County.
- 7. Probation has started planning the expansion of Pretrial Release Services throughout Tioga County. The target date for the expansion of services is April 1, 2023. The expansion includes the presence of Probation Staff in all Justice Courts on days when both the District Attorney's Office and Public Defender's Office are present.

8. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

October of 2022- There were four Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDATs) received for the month of October. The charges included Criminal Obstruction of Breathing, Sexual Abuse in the First Degree, Assault in the Second Degree, and Harassment. Due to the serious nature of the charges, diversion services were not offered and all matters were referred to the County Attorney's Office for possible petition to Family Court.

YTD: 30 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: 26 youth screened (three respondents did not appear and one youth had multiple tickets). Thirteen of the youth screened were determined to be below threshold for mental health services. Nine youth were determined to be a level III and were referred for a mental health assessment. Three youth were determined to be a level II and were referred to mental health for an evaluation and possible treatment. One youth was determined to be a Level I and was referred for immediate crisis services at Tioga County Department of Mental Hygiene.
- Probation continues to support and make referrals to ACBC as their Making Our Success Sustainable (M.O.S.S.) Program continues to grow.
- We have four youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently no probationers being monitored via the VCheck24 cellular phone monitoring app.
- Community Service WWP is up and running effective. The District Attorney's Office
 has included WWP in plea agreements where it is possible to maintain the program.
 WWP is also being used as a graduated sanction on Probation Violations. July 16,
 2022.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 14 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

Court Ordered Investigations: 37 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 187 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 25 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.
