Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report January 7, 2025

Budget Status:

2024 Revenue Budget:

- \$1,150 of DWI Supervision fee collected in December. \$10,245 collected in 2024
- \$695.24 in restitution and surcharge collected in December. \$97,842.88 collected in 2024

2024 Budget: Probation expended 90% of its 2024 budget. This equals a savings to the County for 2024 of \$125,212.45.

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing One open Probation Officer position remains unfilled. At this time there have been no applications submitted to Personnel for review.
- 2. Training All Probation Officers completed their 21 hours of mandated training in 2024. In addition, our most recent Probation Officer hired in 2024 is currently attending his Basic Course for Peace Officer Training at the Academy in Binghamton.
- 3. In December, Probation's new 2023 Dodge Durango was delivered. The Durango was purchased with Pretrial Release money awarded by the State to all Probation Departments in New York. Tioga County received \$60,000. The remainder of the \$60,000 is designated to be used to pay for Evidence Based Interactive Journaling materials for individuals released to the Pretrial Release program in addition to Electronic Monitoring units and gasoline so Officers can travel to the justice courts in Tioga County to assist them with Pretrial Release services.
- 4. Atlas Digital Platform Probation is bringing forth a resolution to enter into a three-year contract with The Change Company to access their Evidence Based digital programs for use with both the Adult and Juvenile populations in Tioga County. The aggregate cost of the contract is slightly more than \$12,000 and will be funded with Pretrial Release Award money as well as Floyd Hooker Foundation money. Probation intends to include a percentage of the cost of the contract in the 2025-2026 Raise the Age Plan which would reimburse Tioga County 100% for the RTA juveniles who utilize the modules.
- 5. On December 17, 2024, members of Probation worked with Veteran's Services and the Rotary at a Veteran's Grocery Giveaway at Catholic Charities in Nichols, NY. More than 50 veterans and their families benefited from the giveaway.
- 6. Highlights of 2024:
 - Initiated the use of IPPC Technologies to monitor sex offenders' use of technology
 - Interagency Collaboration (Veterans, Schools, DSS, Employment, Law Enforcement, District Attorney, Trinity-CASA, ACBC, & TCADS/TCDMH)
 - Probation fleet overhaul (now includes two new 2023 Dodge Durangos)
 - Staffing/training (onboarding new probation officers and scheduling their expanded training, new Probation Supervisor)
 - Enlarged Pre-Trial Release options (AlcoTag/Change Company)
 - Increased community presence

- Embedded Probation Officers in Justice Courts
- Shredding of old records to comply with Records Retention Schedule
- Upgraded the Buddi Electronic monitoring contract to include AlcoTag and insurance
- Outfitted all Officers with iPads allowing them access to the Probation Data system while in the Courts and in the field
- Updated Probation Officer training manual
- Participated in the implementation of the Tioga County TAM team
- Accomplished all goals outlined in the Tioga County Strategic Plan
- Upgraded entry doors and remote monitor
- Began presenting Decisions Points in the schools
- Provided an Officer as a second to assist TCSO with extradition of probation violators

7. Goals and Changes for 2025

- Fully staff Probation with one Officer writing investigations 75% of the time
- Conduct trainings for Tioga County Law Enforcement Agencies, Tioga County Department of Social Services and Tioga County Justices regarding Probation and the services we provide
- Expand Decision Points curriculum in Tioga County School Districts
- Continue with plans to arm Probation Officers with non-lethal capabilities
- Complete Probation Pamphlet and enhance presentation for community outreach
- Succession Planning
- Complete cross training of Officers so there is a Secondary Officer for each specialty caseload
- Train three Officers to participate as instructors in the Southern Tier Training Academy
- Explore reinstituting the Intensive Supervision Program (day reporting) at the Probation Department
- Look at ways to expand the Waverly Satellite Office
- Transition Office Specialist I to work at least 14 hours per week specifically with the Juvenile Justice team

8. Review of Probation's Strategic Plan Goals

9. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

December of 2024- There were three Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDAT) received for the month of December. The JDATs alleged the respondents committed acts which if committed by an adult would constitute the crimes of Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle, a Class A Misdemeanor, Assault in the Third Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor and Making Terroristic Threats, a Class D Felony.

YTD: 37 JDATs received to date.

• E- Connect: To date, Thirty-five (35) youth have been screened in 2024. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, twenty-five (25) youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. One (1) youth was found to be a level II and was referred for a mental health evaluation. Seven (7) youth were found to be a level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. Two (2) youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.

• There are currently two youth participating in juvenile sex offender treatment and one youth in the process of being evaluated.

There were 17 JDATs processed in 2023. The 37 processed in 2024 represents **a more than 100%** increase in JDATs processed by the Tioga County Probation Department.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently four individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- Community Service WWP is currently suspended. When more orders for community service on the WWP are received, operation of the WWP will resume.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 37 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

Court Ordered Investigations: 51 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 176 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 17 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.

GOALS for 2025

Goal 1: Tioga County Probation will facilitate the training of three Probation Officers to become certified as instructors in the future Southern Tier Training Academy.

- 1. Identify Officers to be trained
- 2. Schedule the Officers for training which is anticipated to take place in Tompkins County
- 3. Officers will complete instructor training and identify an area of concentration for further training

Goal 2: Probation will cross-train Officers to develop a "secondary officer" for each specialty caseload.

- 1. Administrative staff will identify Officers to be trained as a "secondary officer" for each specialty caseload.
- 2. Identified Officers will begin shadowing of the "primary officer" no later than March of 2025
- 3. After three to six months of shadowing, the "secondary officer" will be assigned a small percentage of the cases in their specialty area.

Goal 3: Probation will develop a Succession Plan to assure functionality and efficiency of the Department upon the Director position becoming vacant.

- 1. Administrative staff will identify individuals who appear suitable and motivated for advancement within the Department.
- 2. Identified staff will be encouraged to enroll in the next Institute for Advancement.
- 3. Identified staff will spend approximately 5% of their work week shadowing senior staff.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A

CONTRACT BETWEEN THE TIOGA COUNTY

PROBATION DEPARTMENT & THE CHANGE COMPANIES, INC.

WHEREAS: The Legislature approved a contract between Tioga County Probation Department and The Change Companies, Inc. for the provision of an evidence based interactive journaling curriculum for adults and juveniles called Atlas; and

WHEREAS: The contract with The Change Companies, Inc. and Tioga County Probation will have The Change Companies, Inc. provide 25 interactive journaling seats via the Atlas Digital Platform for a cost of \$4,125.00 annually with the approximate total of the three-year contract being \$12,375.00; and

WHEREAS: The Change Companies, Inc. submitted their yearly subscription Agreement to Tioga County Probation which consists of \$4,125.00 yearly for a three-year subscription for a contract period of 1/1/2025 to 12/31/2027 not to exceed \$12,375.00; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Probation Director is approved to contract with The Change Companies, Inc. at a cost not to exceed \$12,375.00 for the period of 1/1/2025 to 12/31/2027 upon review by the County Attorney.
